From the Pastor...Bread From Heaven

During Lent, many of us decide to give up a certain food or a certain activity to symbolize our devotion to God during this holiest time of the year. The focus is usually the "giving up" of something. But I want to challenge us to also "give" our gratitude in our devotion to God during this season of Lent.

For those of you who were able to be at worship on February 18, this next part is going to sound familiar to you, but I feel it's worth repeating. Plus, many who will receive this newsletter were not in worship, so it's new to them.

Many of us are familiar with the story of when Moses led the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt and they ended up in the wilderness. They would travel a bit and set up camp. Then they'd move on. It wasn't too long before they started complaining about food, stating that they should have stayed slaves in Egypt because at least they had food. God provided manna...a substance that would be on the ground each morning and each family would collect just what they needed for the day.

It's such a familiar story that we might not hear the extraordinariness of it. Can you imagine that first morning? Waking up, getting out of your tent to start the fire to make some coffee (they must have had coffee!) and there's this white stuff on the ground (it's not snow)—and it's EVERYWHERE! And they find out that it's edible! The word manna translates, "what is it?" WOAH! A miracle! How grateful they must have been that first day...that first week...maybe even that first month. Praising God for God's provision...bread from heaven...literally. But then, at some point it became "normal". It became "expected". It became ordinary. This miraculous provision became so ordinary that they not only forgot to be grateful, but they started complaining about having the same thing day in and day out.

Now we might judge thinking, Gee, they were really ungrateful. God provided for them every day and yet, grumble, grumble, grumble. They had been slaves in Egypt...mistreated, overworked, but here they are...free... but longing for the food they use to have when they were enslaved. It seems unbelievable until we take a closer look at ourselves.

Maybe God isn't raining down literal bread from heaven today, but aren't there things in our life that we know without a doubt are from God, metaphorical bread from heaven, and at first, we were so thankful, but then, after time, we begin complaining. Maybe it was a job offer...and we took it and were so thankful and we knew God's hand was in it, but then after time we find out it's not perfect. The people we work with aren't perfect...shocker! The work itself challenges us and we begin to grumble. Or maybe it's our home...we know it was a provision from God for us to live where we live (bread from heaven), but then, after a while we find fault. Not enough closet or counter space, not enough cabinets, or the color is all wrong...or it's too much house...too big... can't keep up with cleaning it. Too much yard work. We start grumbling about our bread from heaven. Provision from God.

What is something in your life that you know was provided by God and you were once so grateful but now you take it for granted and maybe even have moments of grumbling? Sometimes it's a person. Sometimes it's an object. Sometimes it's skill. Whatever it is in your life, I challenge you this Lent to start thinking of it again as a gift from God...provision in your life...bread from heaven...and be grateful.

May your Lenten Journey be meaningful.

Sabbatical Plans

Last year there was a special church meeting held to discuss and vote on my taking a five-month sabbatical this year, from April through August. Although it was approved (of which I am deeply grateful), I decided to shorten the time from April 15 through June 30.

This thought of taking a sabbatical originated when I started thinking about retirement (yes, I'm that age) and realizing that I'll continue serving the church as long as I feel called to do so. I'm hoping that this call continues well into my 70's, but only the Lord knows. However, there were a couple things I didn't want to wait until my 70's to do: One of them is writing a daily devotional and another is traveling out west to see some of the National Parks. I want everyone to know that by the grace of God, everything is falling into place, and I just wanted to share a few details in this newsletter.

Retired Pastor Bob Schneider is coordinating the Clergy Supply and working with the Deacons for the 11 Sunday's I'll be gone. He has all Sundays covered and each week, a pastor will be preaching on a different parable.

Pastoral Care will be divided up as I'm asking certain people to check in with those I visit regularly. Pastoral Emergencies will be handled by Bob Schneider and Murray Nickerson. Phone numbers will be made available in the bulletins, church phone messages and website. If there is a death or someone actively dying during these 11 weeks, and if I am in Tilton, I will be there for that person and family.

I will be out of town April 21 – May 11 at a retreat house in Maine for the first 2 of those weeks, starting the writing process, and then traveling to NJ to spend time with family. I'll also be out of town June 6 – 23 as that will be when Warren and I take our trip out west.

Please know I am working with Leadership, with Joisse, and with the small groups (Book Group, Bible Study, Prayer Shawl, etc.) to make sure there's a plan in place to continue seamlessly.

I would like to offer a "Coffee with the Pastor" time after church on April 7th following worship. We can sit in a circle fashion downstairs, and you can voice any questions or concerns you may have regarding this period of time.




Lenten Worship and Study
