From the Pastor...God Says, "I Am Doing a New Thing"

In the book of Isaiah we hear, "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?" (Is. 43:18-19)

Remember the story of Moses and the Israelites? They were slaves for 400 years in Egypt and Moses was sent to set them free. After the final plague they fled and were in the desert for 40 years. At times they grumbled and somehow, their past life in bondage seemed better than their present.

God tells the Israelites, and us, in the book of Isaiah to forget the former circumstances of our lives and see what God is doing in the present. Do you think God's hand is not in the present? We may not understand certain changes in our lives...personally, professionally, governmentally, socioeconomically, etc., but as people of faith, we are called to trust God is ever present... whether we understand circumstances or not.

Just like seeds and bulbs are underground, unseen and seemingly dormant and yet, not. When the time comes, they begin to sprout, bringing beauty to the earth. They don't compare themselves to others. The beautiful spring flowers that pop up, they are living their life in the present...not thinking, "last year was better". In Ecclesiastes we are reminded that to everything there is a season.

We are currently in a season that's a bit tumultuous...perhaps an understatement. Maybe it would be helpful to remember what Apostle Paul tells us when he says that things that are visible are brief and fleeting, while things that are invisible are everlasting (2 Corinth. 4:18).

Do you remember the day everything was closed due to the pandemic? I do. We had to close the church doors on March 15, 2020. Do you remember wearing masks and using lots of hand sanitizers? Do you remember how this made you feel in the beginning? The pit in your stomach? Maybe some fear? Anger? Hurt?

Help Needed

The Community Food Center (CFC) food pantry at St. Andrew's-in-the-Valley serves families in Tamworth and Sandwich reaching 85 households in 2024. Our mission is to ensure that all residents of Tamworth and Sandwich have access to nutritious food, a mission that we can only achieve with your support.

A basic outline of services provided:

- * Year-round food assistance plus added food and/or grocery store gift certificates at Thanksgiving and Christmas.
- * Clients select the foods their family needs from our grocery list.
- * Open to our clients every other Wednesday, 11 am to 3 pm. All of this happens with a 100% volunteer crew.

We rely on both cash and in-kind donations. Cash donations come from many generous individuals, organizations, and faith groups in the area, as well as from the towns of Tamworth and Sandwich. Thankfully, these resources have been stable. In-kind donations of food and other items come from the New Hampshire Food Bank (NHFB), the US Department of Agriculture (USDA), and local businesses. They represent over half of the food and personal care items we distribute to our clients.

In 2024, we saw a 10% drop in in-kind donations from NHFB and USDA, while our caseload grew by 14%. This change has strained our resources and ability to meet the increasing demand. Recently, we learned that an additional \$2500 of USDA funding is at risk. This funding is crucial for us. In the growing seasons of 2022 through 2024, these funds allowed CFC to purchase food from local farmers, which our clients sincerely appreciate. Due to these and other substantial cutbacks at USDA, we are reaching out directly to the communities we serve for donations to support our mission.

Please help us continue this important assistance. Checks can be written to the Community Food Center and mailed to us at PO Box 141, Tamworth, NH 03886 Every contribution, no matter the size, makes a difference.

The CFC Board and volunteers thank you. We are dedicated to keeping food on the table for Tamworth and Sandwich families in need.
